TO commemorate the bravery of Lieutenants Teignmouth Melville and Nevill Coghill Tessiers, the London silversmiths have been commissioned to recreate a limited edition of 602 goblets — one for every member of the regiment killed in action — and have revived the actual process by which the original was hand-made by Hunt and Roskell, one of the best known Victorian silversmiths. The silver goblet shown in the picture belonged to Lt Melvill and was presented by him to his regiment — now called the Royal Regiment of Wales — and is still in use by the regiment.
